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OUR HISTORY

Innovating, illuminating, and inspiring audiences and artists since 1999, Silicon Valley Shakespeare was founded by Sara Betts, Dinna Myers, and Jeff Day as Shady Shakespeare Theatre Company. The company was dedicated to providing more opportunities for artists to perform and audiences to experience Shakespeare and other classic works. The company started with an annual budget of \$1,100 and the dedication of our dynamic leaders and core volunteers. Now SVS has expanded to include a full season of four theatrical offerings in three venues, and a vibrant education program for youth and teens, with an annual budget of over \$300,000.
